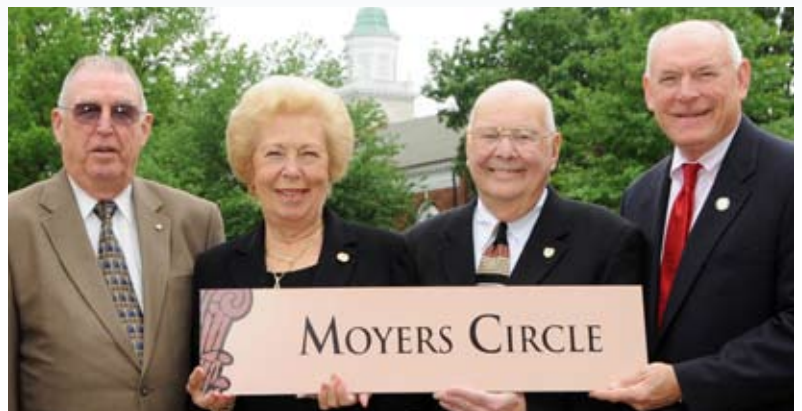
Moyers Circle is home to Care Center
