## National Honors for Shelbyville's superior service

Masonic Home of Shelbyville received My InnerView's Excellence in Action award, a national honor recognizing the Home's commitment to superior customer and workforce satisfaction.

More than 5,000 U.S. nursing homes, including both Masonic Homes, participated in a 2009 My InnerView satisfaction survey. Residents, family members and staff completed satisfaction surveys. Masonic Home scored in the top 10 percent on the questions, "What is your recommendation of this facility to others?" and "What is your recommendation of this facility as a place to work?"

"Masonic Home of Shelbyville deserves to be recognized for their dedication to our residents, family members and staff," said Masonic Homes of Kentucky CEO Gary Marsh. "This award demonstrates the staff's commitment to making a difference in people's lives every day."

This is the first year Masonic Home of Shelbyville has earned the Excellence in Action honor. However, the Home has a history of winning awards. Kentucky Association of Health Care Facilities has awarded the Masonic Home Central District Facility of the Year honors in 2005 and 2009.

Also in 2009, Masonic Home was awarded six KAHCF district awards for professional achievement and recognized Maintenance Director Donald Carey as best in the state last year. Kentucky Association of Homes and Services for the Aging recognized Dining Services Cook Carl Hudson and Therapy Team Lead Leslie Mann as Kentucky's best in 2009.

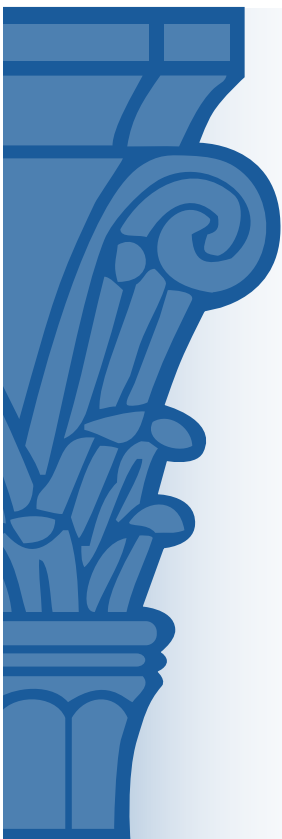
## Great Day, beautiful Homes
