1865

The Civil War leaves hundreds of widows and orphans. Kentucky Masons envision a Masonic Widows and Orphans Home and Infirmary in Louisville.



1871

The Home opens on April 7 near downtown Louisville.



1901

The Old Mason's Home, caring for elderly Masons, opens in Shelbyville.

1925

127 acres is acquired between the Louisville city limits and St. Matthews, and the cornerstone laid for construction of what would become a schoolhouse.



1928

Noted landscape architects the Olmsted Brothers completed the site's master plan.

1954

The Home's on-campus school is closed and children living at the Home attend public schools.



1993

Masonic Widows and Orphans Home and Old Mason's Home merge to become Masonic Homes Kentucky.

1872-1884

A school is established for children. Practical industries become part of Home life, teaching residents shoemaking, printing, chair caning, cooking, gardening and canning, while also providing usable commodities.

1918

Influx of children orphaned by World War I and the influenza epidemic overcrowds the Home. Plans commence to raise money for a new home on a larger site.

1926

New Home, designed to be a self-sufficient campus, is dedicated and residents move from the old Home.



1930

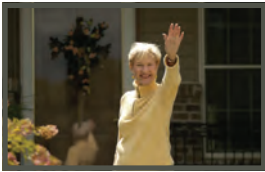
The largest population of children – 632 – live at the Louisville home.

1989

The Home's last orphan leaves, and it focuses on providing senior care, building The Pillars Assisted Care Center.

1997

Six of the cottages that housed widows and orphans are renovated into senior apartments. The dining hall is renovated and renamed The Olmsted, becoming a Louisville landmark for events.



2001

Spring Hill Village Retirement Community in Taylor Mill is established.

2004

Sally's Garden, a memory care neighborhood, opens on the Louisville Campus.



2009

Club Olmsted and The Bistro open in the lower level of The Olmsted, featuring a card room, art and craft studio, theater and billiard room.



2009

Renovation at Masonic Home Shelbyville yields Rehabilitation Center, new dining venue and short-stay accommodations.

2011

Sproutlings Pediatric Day Care & Preschool at Kosair Charities Center opens on the Louisville Campus, the only program in the region serving medically fragile and typical children.



2018

Meadow Active Lifestyle Community, Grove Pointe Assisted Living Community and Care Clinic open on the Louisville Campus. Meadow is the second Life Care community in the region. FirstLight solely owned by Masonic.

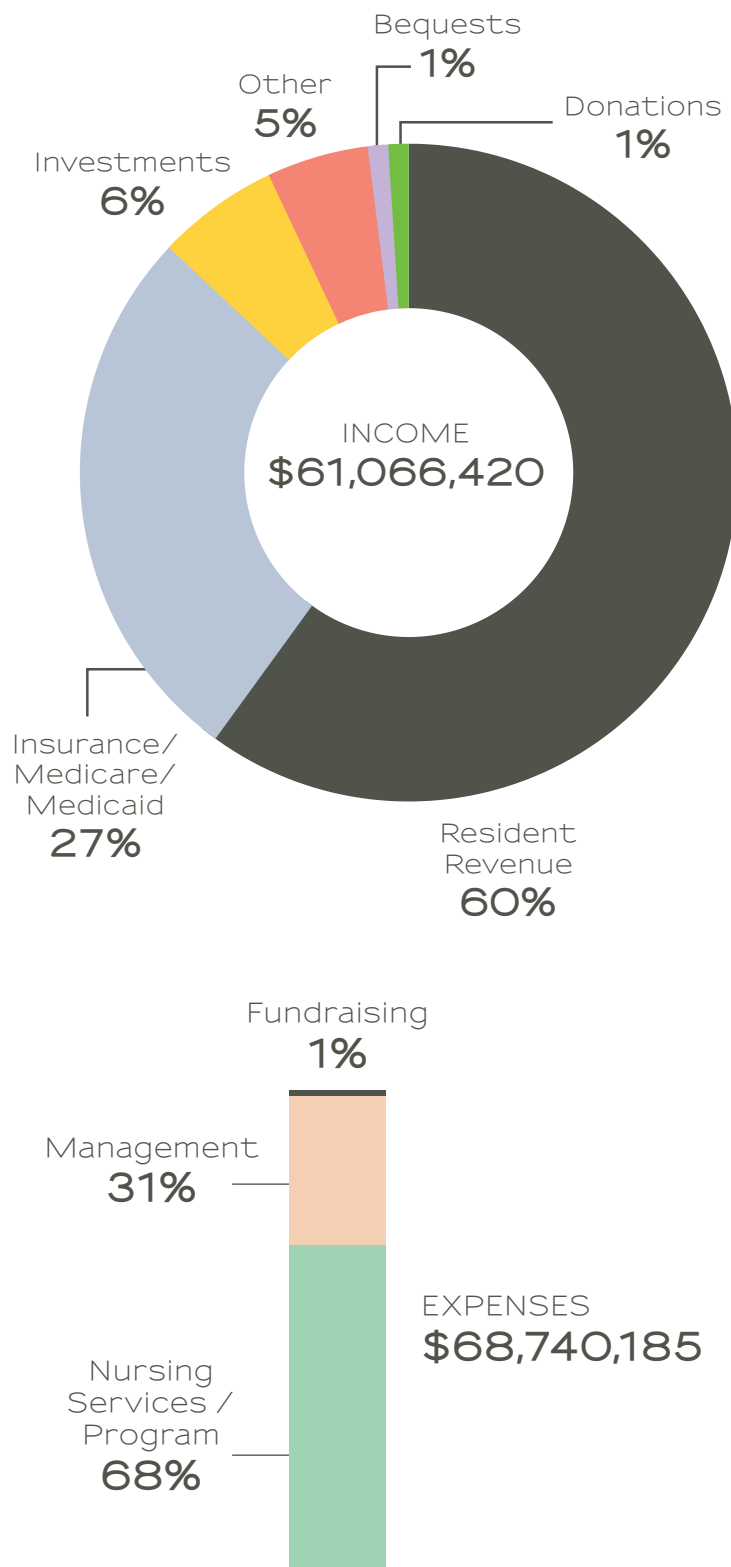

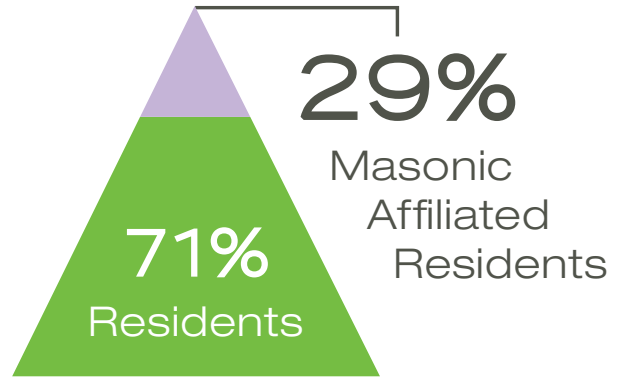

The legacy of caring continues today through Masonicare and other subsidized care, which offers nursing care and other services to those who are unable to fully pay for their care and who meet specific requirements. Each year, Masonic incurs more than \$4 million annually through Masonicare and other subsidized care. This program is made possible primarily by those who use their private funds or insurance to live at Masonic, but it is also sustained by generous donors honoring residents. 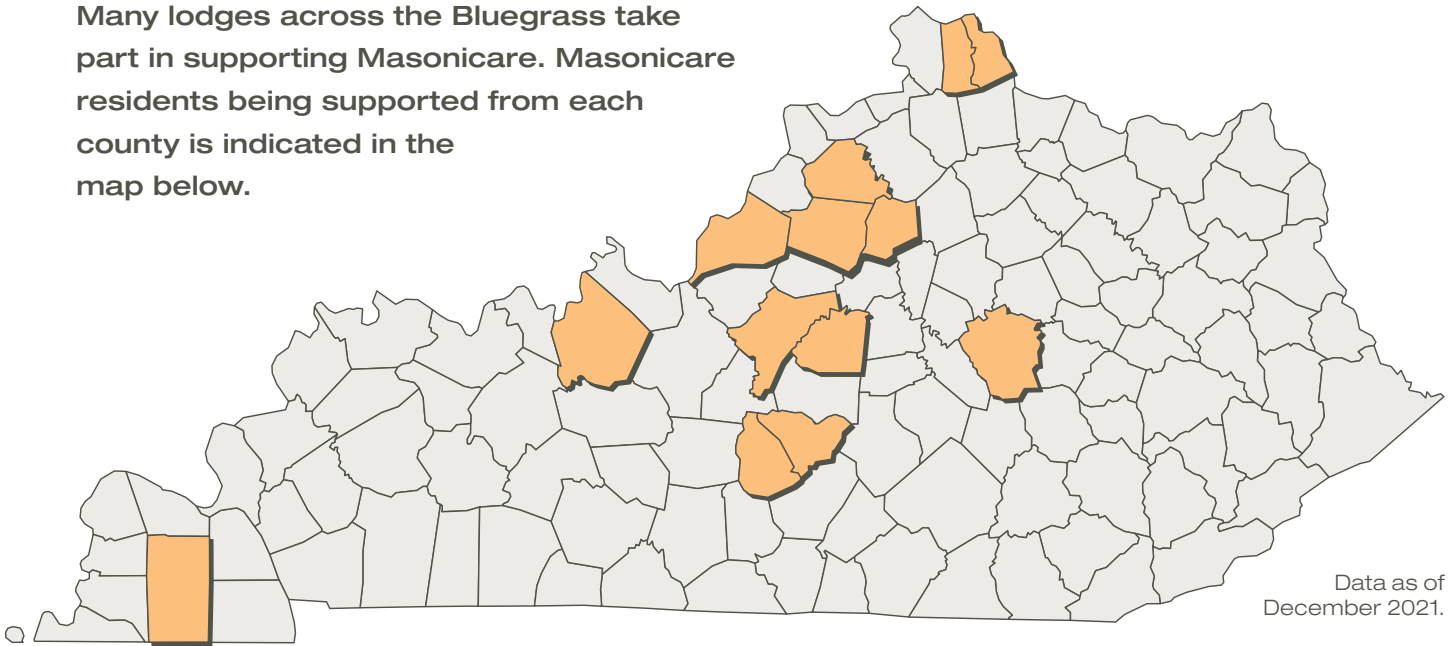

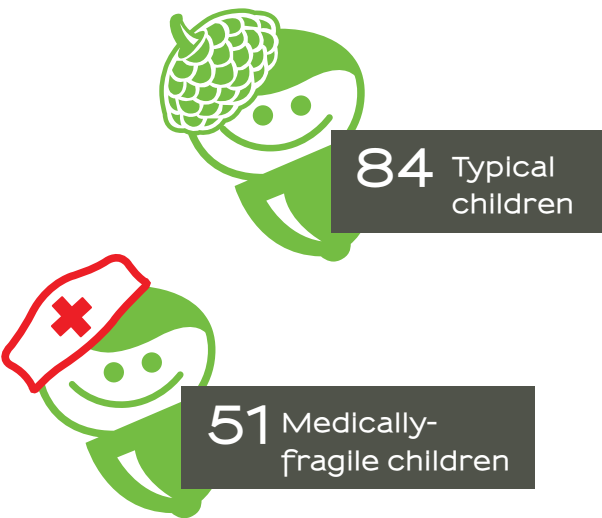
How to Apply

- ▶ Call Masonic Homes' Corporate Office at 866.764.6631 to schedule a meeting to discuss your personal circumstances and determine if you meet minimum eligibility requirements.
- ▶ If you are eligible, you will be asked to complete an application.
- ▶ The approval process consists of an informational meeting, financial review and personal health assessment.
- ▶ The application and approval process may take 90 days or longer.

To meet minimum eligibility requirements, you must be:

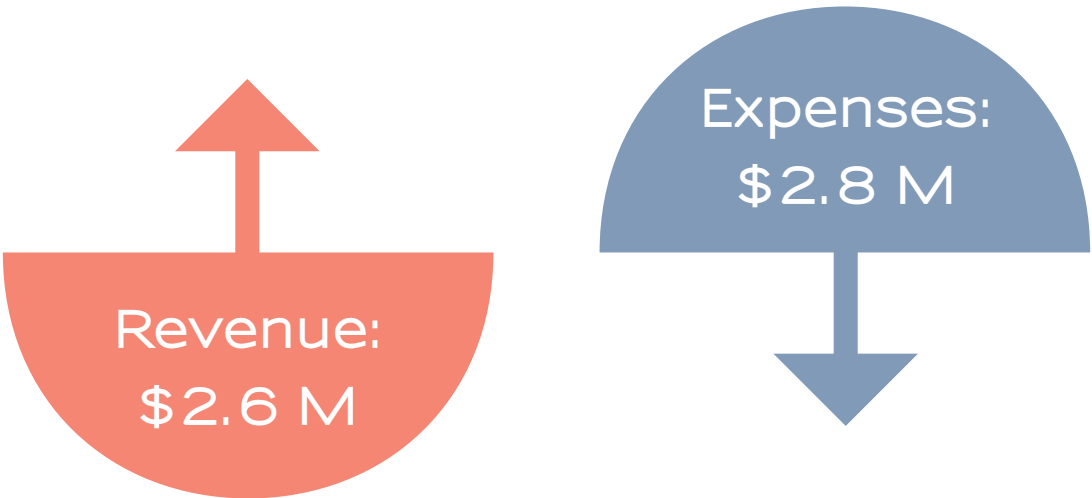
- a Master Mason in good standing with a Kentucky Masonic Lodge for five consecutive years;
- or, the wife of a Master Mason who meets the above eligibility requirements;
- or, the widow of a Master Mason (who met the above eligibility requirements prior to death) who was married for at least five years and has not remarried;
- and, at least 60 years old.

Sproutlings Pediatric Day Care & Preschool at Kosair Charities Center was created in 2010 as a one-of-a-kind center in the Louisville area that offers an integrated program for both medically-fragile and typical children. It was the first Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care (PPEC) center in the region, providing on-site nursing care and therapy services.

Sproutlings strongly believes that interaction is key to the well-being of every child—regardless of abilities. Sproutlings takes a unique approach to childcare for traditional and medically-fragile children, allowing every kid to learn, play and grow with one another.

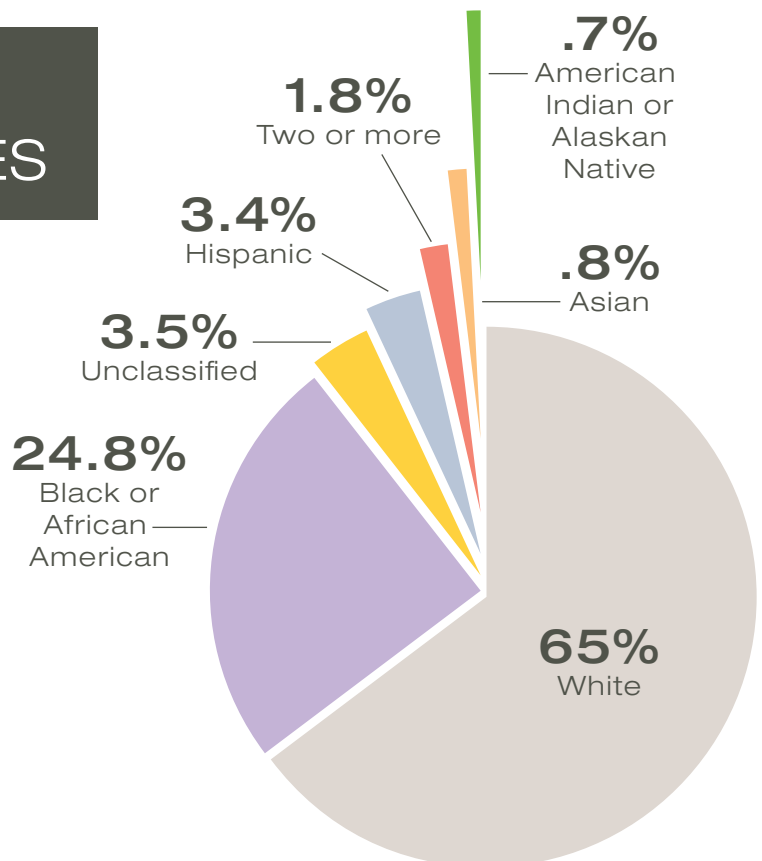
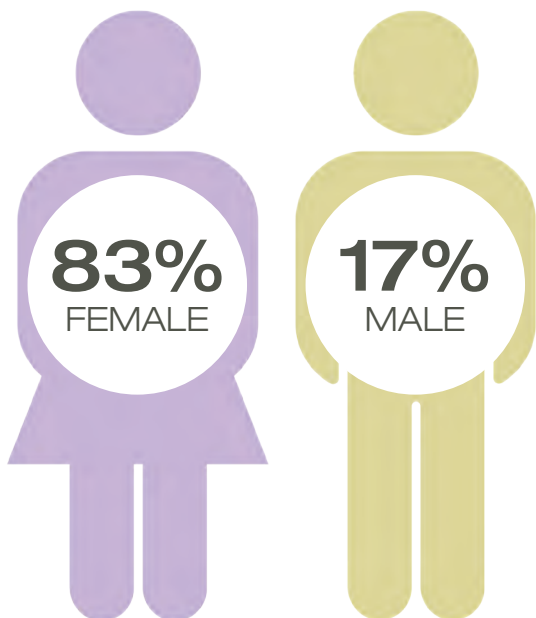

10 YEARS OF INNOVATIVE CARE AND SERVICES

Masonic witnessed a substantial growth in multigenerational services and care in 2010. That's when the Sam Swope Care Center and Sproutlings Pediatric Day Care & Preschool at Kosair Charities Center opened their doors. A decade later and both communities have seen unprecedented growth and changed the norm of what care could look like.

Through one-of-a-kind programming, Sproutlings integrates both medically-fragile and typical children in a nurturing environment where they learn and grow together. Since opening, the program witnessed a 360% increase in the number of medically-fragile children served prompting the need to expand.

Thanks to a generous grant from Kosair Charities, Sproutlings was able to create four new preschool and pre-kindergarten classrooms and a multipurpose room. The expansion allowed Sproutlings to serve an additional 140 students.



Ten years ago, Masonic had a vision to create a Care Center like no other. That vision became the Sam Swope Care Center.

Masonic's Care Center, which spans 196,000 sq. ft., was created to broaden continuum of care. It has provided long-term care, skilled nursing, memory and personal care, short-term recovery and rehabilitation therapy to more than 9,000 residents. It's a dialysis center, and an outpatient rehab provider. When the pandemic hit, its unique design functioned well as a COVID unit.

The Care Center was named after local businessman and entrepreneur, Sam Swope, founder of Sam Swope Automotive. The late Sam Swope made Masonic history by giving the largest individual gift ever received. He was quoted in 2010 saying, "People's needs have changed. They're living longer and they're going to need the services Masonic will be providing at the new Care Center. I'm very glad to be part of the support."
