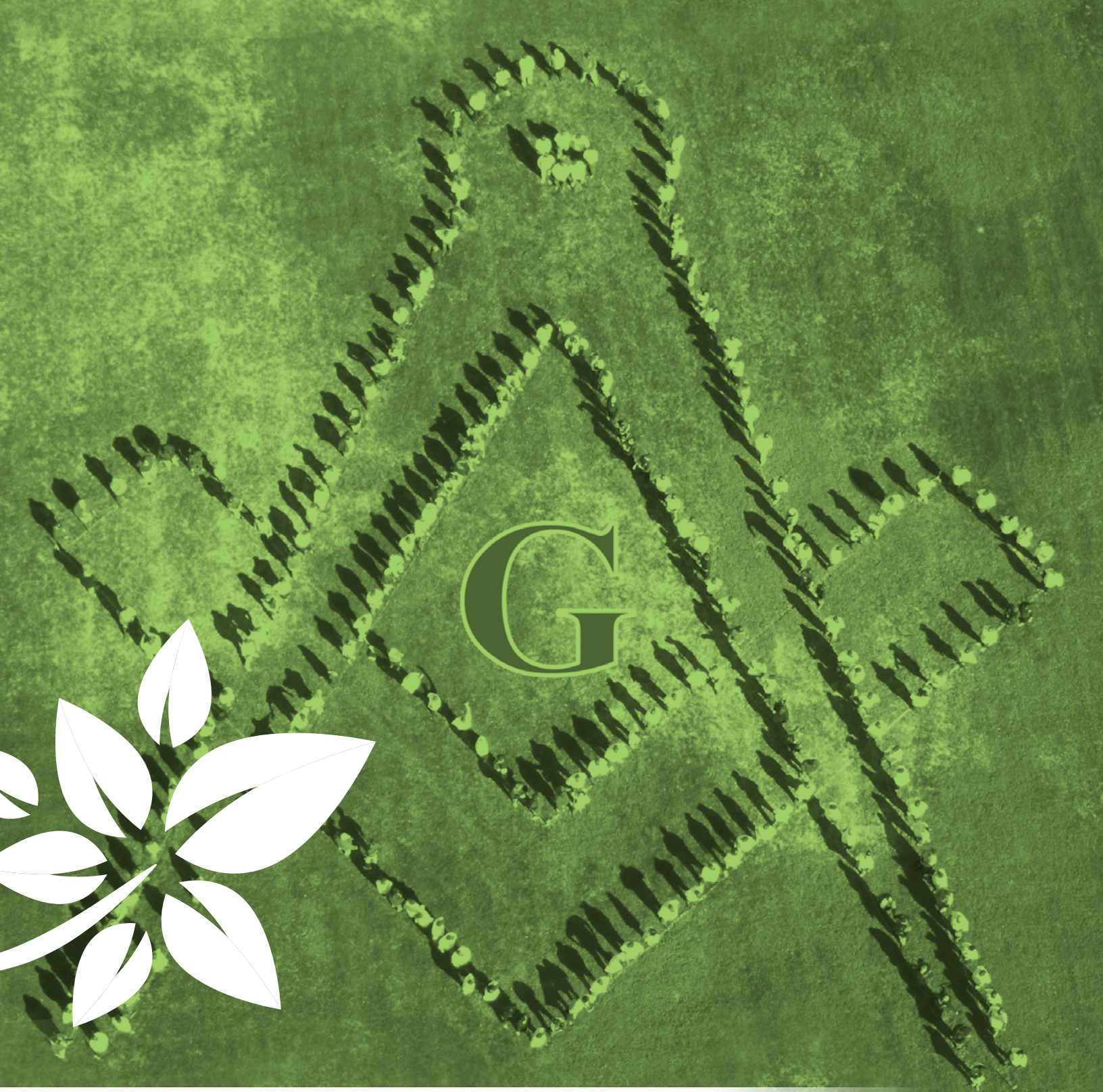
The inaugural event was held at the Club at Olde Stone in September 2022 and Brother Jim was happy to see other businesses support the event.

THE CORNERSTONE OF MASONIC HOMES' LEGACY OF CARING



Masonicare is a program that provides support for Masons, their wives or widows who cannot fully pay for needed care and essential items while residing at one of Masonic Homes communities.

The program is made possible through residents, including Masons, who use their private funds or insurance to reside at Masonic Homes as well as generous donors including Masons and Masonic Lodges.

Masonicare residents, listed on page 10, resided on either the Louisville or Shelbyville campus. The member lodge is listed following the name.



Masonicare Expenditure

Funds for Masonicare residents are used to cover room and board, doctor's visits, prescriptions, and personal items including glasses, dentures, etc.

For the past 10 years, Masonic Homes has spent \$12.88 million on Masonicare residents.

Understanding Masonicare

Those interested in Masonicare must meet the following guidelines and apply for the program. You must be:

- a Master Mason in good standing with a Kentucky Masonic lodge for the previous five consecutive years;
- or, the wife of a Master Mason who meets the above eligibility requirements;
- or, the widow of a Master Mason (who met the above eligibility requirements prior to death) who was married for at least five years and has not remarried;
- and, at least 60 years old.

To apply for Masonicare, call Masonic Homes Corporate Resource Center at 502.259.9627 to schedule a meeting to discuss your personal circumstances and determine if you meet the minimum eligibility requirements.

You or your family will be asked to complete an application. The approval process consists of an informational meeting, and financial review. Recommendations are provided to the Masonic Homes Board of Directors for final approval. The process can take up to 90 days or longer.

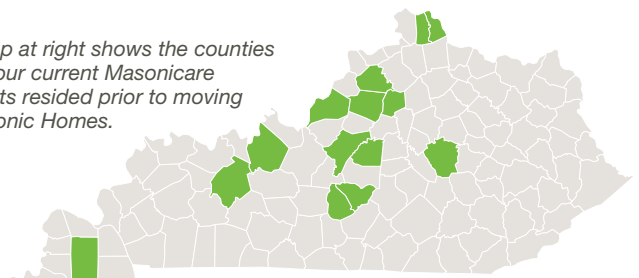

Funds raised through Badge of Mason support Masonicare. The Friends of Masonic Homes program was developed as a way for Masons to support their Lodge's contribution to Badge of a Mason. The Lodge is named a Badge of a Mason once the donations achieved the platinum, gold, silver or bronze giving level. During a presentation about Masonic Homes Adopt-a-Resident program, Brother Louis Prater, a Mason for 33 years, felt a calling to help.

"The presentation and story shared made such an impression on me. My wife and I took care of our parents and I thought we need to give these residents a Christmas." Brother Louis decided this was something he wanted to do, and made an appeal to his fellow Brothers at Winchester Lodge No. 20. "I was invested in the idea and talked to my Lodge Brothers for 30 minutes about participating, and that night I had \$500 in donations."

The first outreach from the Lodge was having cookies delivered and sending cards for various occasions. Brother Louis wanted to make it more personal by taking Lodge members to connect face-to-face with residents. He and his wife went shopping and made up gift bags with blankets, socks, crosswords and puzzles, books and calendars. One Lodge member donated an audio Bible for each resident. Then Lodge members headed to Sam Swope Care Center to deliver the gifts.

"One resident didn't want visitors, but after we asked about his Lodge affiliation we were able to turn it into a great visit." Another resident has all the cards the Lodge had sent her and was excited to show them. One was from Brother Louis and his wife, Susan.

At the next Lodge meeting, the Brothers were able to share about the impact they made and asked more to participate. "I had a list of residents and their birthdays and asked members to pick two or twenty. It didn't matter how many. We just needed to keep doing something for the residents."

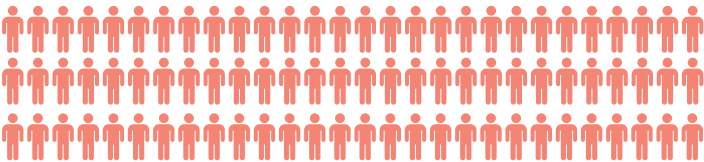
